TRANSITIVE AND INTRANSITIVE VERBS

What is a transitive verb? A transitive verb requires an object in the form of a noun or pronoun to complete its meaning. This object answers to the questions "whom or what?"

Example: The students write composition.

What do the students write? Composition.

Peter loves Mary.

Who (s) does Peter love? Mary.

Formula: Subject + Verb + Object

What is an intransitive verb? An intransitive verb is a verb that does not require an object to complete its meaning. The sentence may end with the verb, an adjective, or an adverb.

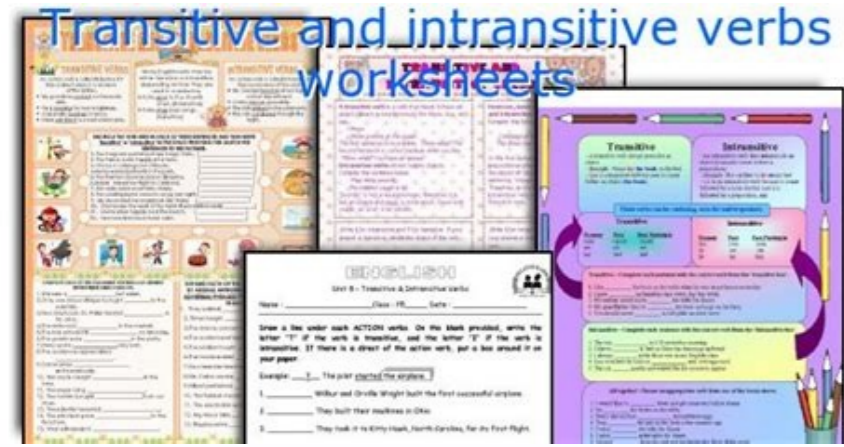
